The Nautilus Welfare Fund is a registered charity set up to support retired seafarers and their dependants. The charity supports both ratings and officers.

Trinity House Hub

In 2014 a new £4m state-of-the-art complex opened in Mariners' Park. The accommodation and community facilities will meet the needs of residents for years to come.



The development, opened by HRH the Princess Royal in April 2014, includes community facilities and 18 one and two bedroom apartments. Staff are available 24 hours a day to ensure a reliable and responsive service for those with support or personal care needs, and daily events are organised for all park residents.









MARINERS' PARK

At the heart of the Nautilus Welfare Fund is the Mariners' Park Estate in Wallasey, which is situated in extensive grounds on the banks of the River Mersey, boasting views of the iconic Liverpool waterfront.

Accommodation is available to retired seafarers and their dependants.

Independent Living

The park provides 112 apartments, bungalows and houses, all available to rent and benefiting from a community alarm service.

The extra care accommodation based in the brand new Trinity House Hub provides one and two bedroom apartments specifically designed to meet the needs of older people. The on site

communal facilities include a health suite, cafe, hobbies room, laundry, hair salon and lounge plus 24-hour care staff.

Home Care

Mariners' Park operates its own domiciliary care service which provides practical support from cleaning to shopping and laundry, as well as supporting those with personal care needs such as washing, dressing, preparing meals and support with medication.

Care Home

The Mariners' Park Care Home offers residential, nursing and short term respite care. It can also support those with dementia. Our caring team of staff deliver a 'person centred' service to all residents. The Home has 32 en suite bedrooms, many with views across the Mersey. A wide range of activities are available.

Choosing a home is never easy but Mariners' Park has a wide range of options available to ensure that retired seafarers can find the home that suits them. A wide range of activities enables residents to develop the camaraderie that comes naturally in any seafaring community.

GRANTS AND BENEFITS ADVICE

Grants

The Charity offers both one-off and regular grants. One-off grants can cover items such as house repairs, the provision of essential household appliances and mobility aids such as motorised scooters. Regular grants are available to those on limited incomes and provide ongoing support. Both grant types are for those in financial

hardship and are available to retired mariners living across the UK.

Benefits advice

Our caseworker is available to assist retired seafarers and their dependants to access the benefits they are entitled to and increase their income. The service also signposts individuals to other services that promote independent living.
